Also, the registration fee is non-refundable and will not be cashed until the application is approved for acceptance.

*When applying for a Russia trip, a copy of your passport application must be included with your mission trip application if you don't currently have a valid passport. Your application will not be processed until we have this in hand.

Personal Covenant & Liability Release Form

The guidelines listed below are recommended for those participating in this journey. You go not as a tourist, but as a guest of another country. Your destination is considered a less developed country and does not have the same conveniences you are used to at home. It is very important to be flexible and willing to adjust to the expectations of your host.

I recognize and accept the following conditions which will further the usefulness and safety of our short-term mission. If accepted as a member of this EEMN Short-Term Mission team, I agree to:

1.	Go as a servant-disciple of Jesus Christ and will adopt that attitude when dealing with my fellow team members and the people I meet during the trip.
2.	Adopt an attitude that I am on this team to try to understand the host culture, not to convince them of my own viewpoint or style. I go knowing that there are many different ways to accomplish the same objective, and know that my way is not necessarily the best.
3.	Abstain from making derogatory comments or arguments regarding people, politics, sports, religion, race or traditions.
4.	Accept and submit to leaders and authority and promise to abide by their decisions concerning this mission trip.
5.	Acknowledge that by engaging in this journey, I am subjecting myself to certain risks voluntarily, including and in addition to those risks that I normally face in my personal and business life, including but not limited to such things as health hazards due to poor food and water, diseases, pests, and poor sanitation; potential injury while working; and inadequate medical facilities.
6.	Understand that our team's work is but a tiny speck on the bigger picture that our mission partners are trying to accomplish. I promise not to be overly demanding, to do by best not to offend or cause embarrassment for the local mission host, and to do my best to help them attain their long-term goals.
7.	Attend all team meetings possible, both in preparation for departure and during the mission trip.
8.	Demonstrate a Christ-like Spirit. My attitude will be like that of Jesus (Phil. 2:5). I will love those with whom I work and those around me throughout the time. I will not allow another's property or personality to be abused. I will refrain from meddling, complaining, and obscene or insensitive humor. I realize that others on my team, during the journey, and while onsite, will look at me for an example of how a Christian acts, and will not treat that responsibility lightly. I understand that travel, especially to remote locations, can be difficult, and I promise to adopt a flexible attitude and be supportive as plans may need to be changed. I understand that I must travel with the rest of the team, unless other prior arrangements are made.
9.	Regard the differing styles of worshiping with respect. I promise that where I see the need, I will witness my faith, but without a superior, colonial attitude.
10.	Avoid any actions which might be perceived as amorous attentions toward indigenous people I meet.

11.	Embrace and demonstrate a high standard in speech, conduct, and dress in the area of sexual purity and Biblical morality. This includes, but is not limited to, inappropriate physical contact/behavior with the opposite sex, coarse or sex-related humor, and immodest clothing/swimwear*. <i>*see short-term missions guides for specific guidelines</i>
12.	Refrain from using alcoholic beverages for the entire length of the trip. Abuse of alcohol is a serious problem across Russia and Eastern Europe. According to our hosts, the concept of social drinking, as some view it in the United States, is nonexistent. Moreover, the idea that at times it is essential to share alcohol with our hosts in order to avoid creating an offense is a myth.
13.	Abstain from all illegal drugs and prohibited activity while on this trip.
14.	Refrain at all times from giving gifts, such as money, clothes, jewelry, computers, mp3 players, etc. Although the intent of the giver is good, the result after we leave can cause problems for our hosts, with jealousy, bitterness or unrealistic expectations among those who do not receive such gifts this trip.
15.	Under no circumstances, whether during the trip or after, should an invitation be extended or a promise made (or inferred) to a student or resident of your host culture to visit the United States.
16.	Remember that we are the new Christians from another part of the world and will be watched very closely. I will not take lightly this important responsibility of setting an example.
17.	Share my faith. I will come prepared to share my testimony with lost people, and to make a clear, concise presentation of salvation to anyone I might meet.
I have read the mission trip responsibilities listed above and agree to follow these while I am participating in the mission trip. I understand that a failure to do so will result in disciplinary action.

EEMN Short-Term Missions Training Agreement Form

Overview & Introduction:

Training is essential in order to have a fruitful short term mission trip that is a blessing for the mission field where you will serve, for you personally, and for your home church. THEREFORE, ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN AND COMPLETION OF THE REQUIRED ASSIGNMENTS IS MANDATORY. We realize that all of us are adults, and lead busy lives. We recognize these realities, but we must also structure the training in a way that acknowledges that all of us are affected when a team member comes unprepared. You can expect that each assignment should take no more than a few hours, a worthwhile investment in preparation that you will not regret once you arrive! Because of the fact that team members come from across the US, use of a computer, email, and the internet for assignments and team communication is expected. If you have no computer available there is always your local church, other family members, or the public library.

Since most team members come from congregations with only 1 or 2 participants, this plan relies on independent study, with written work emailed to the EEMN,. Your commitment to actively participate in the training is vital as you take part in the reading, the written responses, and, when possible, the team training event in Minneapolis, or wherever group meetings take place.

- Team member regular email contribution reports will only be sent out to those who are current in their training.
- Airline tickets will be reserved for all team members upon application with the rest of the team. Final purchase of airline flights will only be completed at the appropriate time for team members who are current in their training.

<NOTE> *There are three (3) schedules for training:*

1. ***Team members taking their first EEMN Trip will use the “FIRST TIME TEAM MEMBER TRAINING SCHEDULE,”*** which uses assignments and readings from SHORT TERM MISSIONS WORKBOOK (Dearborn).
2. ***Team members who have already participated in an EEMN Trip once before will use the “RETURNING TEAM MEMBER TRAINING SCHEDULE,”*** which uses assignments and readings from STEPPING OUT: A GUIDE TO SHORT TERM MISSIONS (YWAM).
3. ***Team members who have already participated in multiple EEMN trips and have previously completed the first two training schedules will use the “VETERAN TEAM MEMBER TRAINING SCHEDULE,”*** which uses assignments and readings from either IGNITING A PASSION FOR MISSIONS (Bill Moberly) or LET THE NATIONS BE GLAD: THE SURPREMACY OF GOD IN MISSIONS (Piper).

Time Frame:

Six lessons, to be completed individually, one every two weeks, over a 12 week period.
